

















Theories on the existence and validity of standards.

Traditionally, it is considered that the norm behaves as follows through individuals:

- Most members of a society (S) take an action or impose a constraint (A) under certain conditions ©
- If someone (x) does not follow the rule, they will be criticized by other S members and such criticism will be seen as justified by other S members, so that criticism will not be criticized by themselves.

 \bullet Members of S refer to the rule with expressions like: x should do A when C or there is a rule that says ...

in order to justify their actions or requests made by others, criticism of the behavior.
